

Health and Safety Policy Statement 2021-22

Introduction

Scope

- Consulting with our employees using methods such as our SHEQ Committee.

- Involving our supply chain in the continual improvement of health and safety.
- Making certain our employees are trained and competent to carry out their work and have the appropriate information, instruction and training for the work they undertake.
- Applying to hierarchy of control when it comes to health and safety risk management.
- Reviewing and improving our health and safety management standards at all levels of the business.
- Ensuring that hazardous areas are kept secure from the person[s] not required to enter them.
- Ensuring that all plant and equipment is maintained in a safe condition and is subject to routine and statutory inspections and examinations.
- Continually improving health and safety risk management.
